Faculty	Programmes	Programme requirements under the Student Handbook that cannot be handled by CUSIS
Arts	Anthropology	Students may select up to four related courses (12 units) offered by the Department of History and the Department of Japanese Studies or up to three related courses (9 units) offered by other Departments or Programmes (undergraduate or postgraduate) as approved by Department for fulfillment of major programme requirement. The system will not count these courses towards fulfillment of requirements automatically. Students need to approach the Major Department for advice.
	Chinese Language and Literature	Students have to take CHLL4001 and CHLL4002 to fulfil Major requirements. But CHLL4001, being a 0-unit course, will NOT be shown on the advisement reports.
	Fine Arts	Students may select up to four courses (12 units) out of CURE2031, 2037, 3017, 3020 offered by the Department of Cultural and Religious Studies as Art History elective courses. The system will not count these courses towards fulfillment of requirements automatically. Students need to approach the Major Department for advice.
	History	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Students may select up to 15 units (five courses) from ANTH2310, 2340, 2520, 3430 and JASP1180, 3110 offered by the Department of Anthropology and Japanese Studies as elective courses. The system will not count these courses towards fulfillment of requirements automatically. Students need to approach the Major Department for advice.</li> <li>2. <u>Students admitted in 2020-21 and 2021-22</u> have to take HIST4801 and HIST4802 to fulfil Major requirements. But HIST4801, being a 0-unit course, will NOT be shown on the advisement reports.</li> </ol>
	Linguistics	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Students whose first language is not Chinese may take Cantonese and Putonghua to fulfill the language courses requirement. The system cannot identify this group of students. Students need to approach the Major Department for relevant arrangement, and the Department will inform RES for follow-up.</li> <li>2. Students have to take LING4001 and LING4000 to fulfil Major requirements. But LING4001, being a 0-unit course, will NOT be shown on the advisement reports.</li> </ol>
Science	Chemistry	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Students of Enrichment Stream have to take CHEM4980/4990, and other Chemistry students have to take one combination from either CHEM4030/4040 or CHEM4980/4990 to fulfil Major requirements. But CHEM4030 or CHEM4980, being a 0-unit course, will NOT be shown on the advisement reports.</li> </ol>

Science	Chemistry	2. Students of Enrichment Stream admitted from 2019-20 to 2022-23 need to complete Experiential Learning (at least 4 consecutive weeks of outside Hong Kong exposure). This requirement, however, will NOT be shown on the advisement reports.
	Mathematics	<p>1. Students of Mathematics-Multidisciplinary Stream should take MATH courses at 3000 or above level, and/or courses at 2000 or above level of at most two other subject areas offered by the Faculties/Departments of Science, Engineering, Economics, and Finance, with at least 9 units of non-MATH courses.</p> <p>2. Students of Mathematics Stream admitted in 2017-18 and thereafter should take MATH courses at 3000 or above level, and/or courses at 2000 or above level of one other subject area offered by the Faculties/Departments of Science, Engineering, Economics and Finance.</p> <p>The system will not count the courses of non-MATH subject areas towards fulfillment of requirements automatically. Students need to approach the Major Department for declaration of the subject area/s, and the Department will inform RES for follow-up.</p>
Business Administration	Quantitative Finance	Note 3 of the study scheme states that completion of an eligible second major or minor programme from the Faculty of Engineering (Computer Science, Electronic Engineering, Information Engineering) or the Faculty of Science (Mathematics, Physics, Risk Management Science, Statistics) is deemed to have satisfied 4(a) Quantitative Methods area of elective courses requirement. CUSIS cannot process the exemption in the advisement report. Students who have fulfilled the eligible second major or minor programme will still have outstanding requirement in 4(a) in CUSIS.
Education	Bachelor of Arts (Chinese Language Studies) and Bachelor of Education (Chinese Language Education) Co-terminal Double Degree Programme	Students whose first language is Putonghua and who have passed a recognized Putonghua proficiency test can be exempted from CLED2530 and /or 3530. The system cannot identify this group of students. Students need to approach the Major Department, and the Department will inform RES for follow-up.
Engineering	Computer Science	Students who have taken both ENGG3802 and ENGG3803 can use these two courses to fulfil their major elective requirements. The system will not count these courses towards fulfillment of requirements automatically. Students need to approach the Major Department, and the Department will inform RES for follow-up.

Social Science	Economics	<p>Students who have taken the corresponding course listed in Column B need to approach the Department of Economics for approval for exemption of course listed in Column A.</p> <p>Minor students who have taken DSME1030/1040 need to approach the Department of Economics for approval for exemption of ECON2011/2021. Students are required to take a replacement course ECON2311 or any ECON course at 3000 level or above to fulfil the requirement.</p>
	Psychology	<p>Major/Minor students who have taken any of the equivalent statistics course of PSYC2010 need to approach the Department of Psychology for approval for exemption of PSYC2010, and are required to take another PSYC courses to compensate for the units.</p>
